Important Deadlines

- **Registration deadline for attendance only participants:** August 28, 2026
- **Summer School:** October 1–2, 2026

Presentation Formats

To accommodate the diverse needs, goals, and motivations of participants, we offer several formats for contributions:

- **Long Discussion Forum:** A platform to explore questions related to the dissertation project or individual studies in depth (8-10 minute introductory talk + 40 minutes for interactive workshop formats, such as guided discussions, group work, etc., to address key questions with the audience).
Abstract requirements: approx. 500 words plus a description of the objectives and a rough timetable
- **Short Discussion Forum:** A platform to explore questions related to the dissertation project or individual studies in depth (8-10 minute introductory talk + 20 minutes for interactive workshop formats, such as guided discussions, group work, etc., to address key questions with the audience).
Abstract requirements: approx. 300 words plus a description of the objectives
- **Poster:** Presentation and exchange in a poster session.
Abstract requirements: approx. 300 words

Please understand that, as in previous years, we need to limit the number of both contributions and participants in order to ensure the event format works effectively.
